RE: **Council Sponsored Initiative Measure Prohibiting Amendment or Repeal of Ordinance No. 1848 "Fund Balance Reserve Requirements" Without Submitting the Question to the Voters for Approval.**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Adopt the attached Resolution Bill No. 12-065 (Attachment No. 1):

**"A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEMET, CALIFORNIA:**

- (1) **CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012, AND GIVING NOTICE THEREOF;**
- (2) **REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY CONDUCT SAID ELECTION AND CONSOLIDATE IT WITH THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012;**
- (3) **SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION A MEASURE TO ADOPT ORDINANCE NO. 1855;**
- (4) **DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO PREPARE AN IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF THE MEASURE; AND,**
- (5) **DETERMINING THAT THE ACTION IS NOT A "PROJECT" WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACTION ("CEQA") PURSUANT TO 14 CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTION 15378(B)(4) AND DOES NOT REQUIRE**

**CEQA REVIEW PURSUANT TO PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE SECTION 21080(a)."**

2. Adopt the attached Resolution Bill No. 12-066 (Attachment No. 2):

**"A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEMET, CALIFORNIA, SETTING PRIORITIES FOR FILING WRITTEN ARGUMENTS REGARDING A CITY MEASURE AND PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF REBUTTAL ARGUMENTS FOR CITY MEASURES SUBMITTED AT MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS"**

**BACKGROUND:**

On May 8, 2012, the City Council adopted Ordinance 1848 adding Division 7 "General Reverse Fund Balance Requirements" to Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Hemet Municipal Code as Sections 2-450 through 2-452. This Ordinance became effective on June 7, 2012.

Born of the City's fiscal crisis of the past several years, the intent of the Ordinance was to promote prudent fiscal planning and resource utilization and to establish a minimum general fund reserve requirement. This intent is further defined in Section 2-450 "Purpose." The Ordinance created a minimum General Fund reserve requirement of 35% of current expenditures and segregates the reserve into three components:

- Emergency/Disaster Reserve equal to at least 10% of General Fund budgeted expenditures;
- Economic Stabilization Reserve equal to at least 15% of General Fund budgeted expenditures; and
- Working Capital Reserve equal to at least 10% of General Fund budgeted expenditures.

The Ordinance provides that use of Emergency/Disaster Reserve and Economic Stabilization Reserve funds require the 4/5<sup>th</sup> vote of the Council membership, while the City Manager is authorized to expense Working Capital Reserve funds if the conditions specified in the Ordinance are met. When funds are withdrawn from a reserve account, the Ordinance requires the City Manager to present a plan to the City Council to replenish the fund within a specified time.

The Mayor has requested that the Office of the City Manager and City Attorney prepare the necessary documents for the City Council to discuss placing a measure on the ballot for voter consideration at the General Election on November 6, 2012, regarding subsequent amendments to, or the repeal of any provision of, Ordinance 1848 that would require obtaining approval of such proposed amendment or repeal by the voters of the City of Hemet.

The City Attorney's Office has prepared proposed Ordinance 1855 (Attachment No. 3) to satisfy this requirement. Ordinance 1855 amends Ordinance 1848 by adding a new section to the Hemet Municipal Code stating:

**"Section 2-453 Amendment and Repeal"**

"The City shall not amend or repeal the provisions of this Division 7, as adopted by Ordinance 1848, either in whole or in part, without obtaining the approval of the voters of the City of Hemet for such proposed amendment or repeal."

Division 7 "Reserve Fund Balance Requirements" is the portion of Hemet Municipal Code (consisting of Sections 2-450 through 2-452) added by Ordinance 1848 encompasses the Council's general fund reserve requirements. By having Ordinance 1855 adopted by the voters, and adding new Section 2-453 to the Municipal Code, it will not be legally permissible for the City to amend or repeal any provision in Division 7 without having that change approved by the voters.

**ANALYSIS:**

The proposed amendment to Ordinance 1848 is appropriate for consideration as an imitative measure. The establishment of a budget for each fiscal year, fiscal planning and the establishment of reserve funds are legislative decisions. Also, such an amendment does not appear to impair the essential functions of City government, but would serve to further strengthen the City's fiscal system.

The deadline to submit the Measure and related resolutions to the Registrar and for the Clerk to provide required notice is Friday, August 10, 2012, for the General Election on November 6, 2012.

**CEQA:**

Pursuant to the CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15378(b)(4)) government fiscal activities which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment are not a "project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and therefore do not require review. (Public Resources Code § 21080(a)).

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The Riverside County Registrar of Voters estimates its costs to conduct the required special election for the measure at between \$16,500 to \$20,000, and the City Attorney's Office estimates legal fees at between \$3,500 and \$5,500.

- 2. REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY CONDUCT SAID ELECTION AND CONSOLIDATE IT WITH THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012;**
- 3. SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION A MEASURE TO ADOPT ORDINANCE NO. 1855;**
- 4. DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO PREPARE AN IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF THE MEASURE; AND**
- 5. DETERMINING THAT THE ACTION IS NOT A "PROJECT" WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT ("CEQA") PURSUANT TO 14 CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTION 15378(B)(4) AND DOES NOT REQUIRE CEQA REVIEW PURSUANT TO PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE SECTION 21080(a).**

**WHEREAS**, on May 8, 2012, the Hemet City Council adopted Ordinance 1848, adding Division 7 "Reserve Fund Balance Requirements" to Article V "Finance" of Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Hemet Municipal Code with the intent of promoting prudent fiscal planning, the conservation of fiscal resources, and the establishment of minimum General Fund reserves requirements; and,

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 1848 requires the City to maintain combined General Fund reserves equaling at least 35% of budgeted expenditures, establishes a 4/5ths Council vote requirement to utilize Emergency / Disaster Reserves and Economic Stabilization Reserves, and requires the City Manager to submit a repayment plan to the City Council when reserve funds are withdrawn; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that the fiscal controls put in place by Ordinance 1848 are in the best interests of the public in that they protect the fiscal

1 viability of the City and its ability to continue to provide quality public services to its  
2 residents; and,

3  
4 **WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that the requirements established by  
5 Ordinance 1848 are critical to the fiscal survival of the City to such an extent that  
6 subsequent amendments to, or the repeal of, Ordinance 1848 may jeopardize the  
7 solvency of the City and be contrary to the public's interest; and,

8 **WHEREAS**, the City Council therefore proposes that Ordinance No. 1855,  
9 attached hereto as Exhibit "B," be submitted to the voters of the City of Hemet which  
10 would prohibit the City from making any amendment or repeal of Ordinance 1848, unless  
11 the proposed amendment or repeal is first submitted to, voted on, and approved by the  
12 qualified electors of the City.

13 **NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of Hemet does Resolve,  
14 Determine, Find and Order as follows:

15 **SECTION 1.** There is called and ordered to be held in the City of Hemet,  
16 California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, a special election.

17 **SECTION 2.** That pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections  
18 Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside is hereby requested to  
19 consent and agree to the consolidation of the special election called in Section 1 of this  
20 Resolution with the County's general election on Tuesday, November 6, 2012.

21 **SECTION 3.** The City Council does hereby order submitting to the voters at the  
22 Consolidated General Election to be held in the City of Hemet on November 6, 2012, the  
23 following measure, a full copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A:

Shall City of Hemet Ordinance No. 1855 entitled “Voter Approval Required For Amendments To Reserve Fund Balance Requirements,” which would require the City to submit to and obtain the approval of the City’s voters for any proposed amendment to or repeal of Ordinance 1848 “Reserve Fund Balance Requirements,” be approved by the voters of the City of Hemet?	

**SECTION 4.** That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

**SECTION 5.** The Riverside County Elections Division is authorized to canvass the returns of the Special Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.

**SECTION 6.** The Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Elections Division to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the Special Municipal Election.

**SECTION 7.** The City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County of Riverside Registrar of Voters to procure and furnish all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

**SECTION 8.** The Clerk shall prepare and publish a synopsis of the measure as required by Section 12111(a) of the Elections Code of the State of California. The Clerk shall also prepare, publish, and post notice of the last date for receiving arguments for and against the measure.

**SECTION 9.** In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections. All persons

1 qualified and registered to vote in the City of Hemet as of the date of the election shall  
2 be entitled to vote.

3 **SECTION 10.** That the City of Hemet recognizes that additional costs will be  
4 incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the  
5 County for any costs.

6 **SECTION 11.** The City Clerk is directed to forward copies of the measure to be  
7 voted on at the Consolidated General Election to the City Attorney for the preparation of  
8 an impartial analysis in compliance with applicable law.

9 **SECTION 12.** The City Council finds that proposed Ordinance 1855 is a  
10 government fiscal activity because it regulates the accumulation and utilization of  
11 reserves for the City's General Fund Reserve and is an integral part of the City's fiscal  
12 planning and budgeting process. The City Council further finds that Ordinance 1855,  
13 although creating reserve funds, does not appropriate or otherwise commit those funds  
14 to any specific project, whether or not such project would have an impact on the  
15 environment. The City Council takes note that 14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15378(b)(4) of the  
16 California Environmental Quality Act [Public Resources Code § 21000 et seq.,] ("CEQA")  
17 Guidelines [14 Cal. Code Regs., §15000 et seq.,] establishes that government fiscal  
18 activities which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result  
19 in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment do not constitute a  
20 "project" within the meaning of CEQA. Based on the foregoing and the entire record  
21 before it, the City Council determines that its action to place proposed Ordinance 1855  
22 on the ballot and the voters' adoption of proposed Ordinance 1855 does not constitute a  
23 "project" within the meaning of CEQA, therefore, is not subject to review under CEQA  
24 pursuant to Public Resources Code § 21080(a).

SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 1848, enacted by vote of the Hemet City Council on May 8, 2012, which established a minimum General Fund Reserve equal to 35% of budgeted General Fund expenditures, requires a vote of 4/5<sup>th</sup> of the City Council membership to authorize use of Emergency / Disaster Reserves and Economic Stabilization Reserves, and requires the City Manager to submit a repayment plan to the City Council when General Fund Reserves are used, is hereby amended by Ordinance 1855 to add a new Section 2-453 to the Hemet Municipal Code to read as follows:

**"2-453: AMENDMENT OR REPEAL.**

The City shall not amend or repeal the provisions of this Division 7, as adopted by Ordinance 1848, either in whole or in part, without first obtaining approval of such proposed amendment or repeal by the voters of the City of Hemet ."

SECTION 2: Ordinance 1855 shall take effect according to law ten (10) days after certification of its passage.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

MEASURE AND PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF  
REBUTTAL ARGUMENTS FOR CITY MEASURES  
SUBMITTED AT MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS**

**WHEREAS**, in Resolution No. 12-065, the City of Hemet called a Special Election to be held on November 6, 2012; and,

**WHEREAS**, § 9282 of the Elections Code of the State of California authorizes the City Council to file a written argument for or against city measures submitted at municipal elections; and,

**WHEREAS**, § 9285 of the Elections Code of the State of California authorizes the City Council to provide for the filing of rebuttal arguments for city measures submitted at municipal elections.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of Hemet does Resolve, Determine, Find and Order as follows:

**SECTION 1.** On behalf of the entire City Council, a subcommittee comprised of two Council Members can be designated to prepare and file a written argument, not exceeding 300 words regarding the City measure, accompanied by the printed names and signatures submitting it, in accordance with article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the elections Code of the State of California and to change the argument until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk after which no arguments for or against the City measure may be submitted to the City Clerk.

The arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk, signed, with the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an

1 organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at  
2 least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. The arguments shall  
3 be accompanied by the Form of Statement To Be Filed By Author(s) of Argument.

4 **SECTION 2.** That pursuant to Section 9285 of the Elections Code of the State of  
5 California, when the elections official has selected the arguments for and against the  
6 measure which will be printed and distributed to the voters, the elections official shall  
7 send a copy of an argument in favor of the proposition to the authors of any argument  
8 against the measure, and a copy of an argument against the measure to the authors of  
9 any argument in favor of the measure immediately upon receiving the arguments.

10 The author or a majority of the authors of an argument relating to a city measure  
11 may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument not exceeding 250 words or may authorize  
12 in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument.  
13 A rebuttal argument may not be signed by more than five authors.

14 The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk, signed, with the printed  
15 name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an  
16 organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at  
17 least one of its principal officers, not more than 10 days after the final date for filing direct  
18 arguments. The rebuttal arguments shall be accompanied by the Form of Statement To  
19 Be Filed By Author(s) of Argument.

20 Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the direct arguments.  
21 Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the direct argument which it seeks to  
22 rebut.

23 **SECTION 3.** That all previous resolutions providing for the filing of rebuttal  
24 arguments for city measures are repealed.

25 **SECTION 4.** That the provisions of Section 2 shall apply at the next ensuing  
26 municipal election and at each municipal election after that time.

27 **SECTION 5.** That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this  
28 Resolution.

INITIATIVE ORDINANCE NO. 1855**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HEMET, CALIFORNIA  
ENTITLED "VOTER APPROVAL REQUIRED FOR  
AMENDMENTS TO RESERVE FUND BALANCE  
REQUIREMENTS."**

**WHEREAS**, by adoption of Resolution Bill No. 12-065, the City Council has submitted this Ordinance 1855 to the voters of the City of Hemet for approval.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HEMET DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1: ADDITION OF SECTION 2-453 TO THE HEMET MUNICIPAL CODE.** A new Section 2-453 is hereby added to the Hemet Municipal Code to read as follows:

**"2-453: AMENDMENT OR REPEAL.**

The City shall not amend or repeal the provisions of this Division 7, as adopted by Ordinance 1848, either in whole or in part, without first obtaining approval of such proposed amendment or repeal by the voters of the City of Hemet."

**SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY.**

If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE.**

As provided for in Elections Code Section 9217, this Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after certification of its passage by the voters of the City of Hemet.
